- e. Specific issues pertaining to water, recreation and socio-economic resources and CCSD:
 - Quality and quantity of available water at Bullards Bar vs. the high demands for that water from CalFed and other entities. The needs are:
 - a. Maintaining and improving water shed for tourism –recreation and the fishery
 - b. Maintaining and improving watershed to improve ground water
 - Recreation- the risks vs. benefits of tourists in the Sphere of Influence of CCSD
 - a. Benefit: Tourists recreating at Bullards Bar have a positive economic impact
 - b. Risk: Tourists create increased fire hazards, medical emergencies, hazardous materials incidents, increased traffic and trash,— all of which negatively impact the CCSD, CVFD due to increased responses to Bullards Bar and the need for a high level of preparedness for the CCSD, CVFD to be able to respond to same.
 - Socio-Economics -Camptonville is an economically depressed area which could benefit
 from increased tourism. However, CVFD has a limited budget, volunteers, supplies and
 limited/outdated equipment. All of these factors put a large strain on the budget,
 manpower and equipment of CVFD.
