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
Dear Mr. Donaldson:

On January 4, 2011, the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC or Commission) issued a notice of commencement of proceeding for the relicensing of Yuba County Water Agency's (YCWA) Yuba River Development Project, FERC Project No. 2246 (Project). A copy of FERC's notice is attached to this letter (Attachment 1). Part "k" of the notice initiated informal consultation with the California State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO), as required by Section 106 of the National Historical Preservation Act and the implementing regulations of the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation at 36 CFR Section 800.2, for the relicensing of the Project (i.e., the undertaking). Part "l" of the notice designated YCWA as the Commission's nonfederal representative for carrying out the informal consultation.

The Yuba River Development Project, which ranges in elevation from 280 feet to 2,049 feet, is located in Yuba, Sierra, and Nevada counties, California, on the main branches of the Yuba River, the North Yuba River, and the Middle Yuba River and on Oregon Creek, a tributary of the Middle Yuba River. Existing Project facilities include:

- 1 dam and associated storage reservoir New Bullards Bar
- · 2 diversion dams Our House and Log Cabin
- 2 diversion tunnels Lohman Ridge and Camptonville
- 2 underground power tunnels New Colgate and Narrows 2
- 1 aboveground penstock New Colgate
- 3 powerhouses New Colgate, New Bullards Minimum Flow, and Narrows 2
- 7 recreation areas Emerald Cove Marina, Hornswoggle Group Camp, Schoolhouse Family Camp, Dark Day Campground, Dark Day Boat Ramp, Garden Point Campground, and Madrone Cove Campground

At this time, YCWA proposes to operate the Project as it has been operated historically, and does not propose any significant changes to Project facilities. A map showing Project facilities is attached to this letter (Attachment 2).



As the Commission's non-federal representative, YCWA has determined the Area of Potential Effects (APE) for the undertaking. The proposed APE encompasses all lands within the FERC Project Boundary, with the exception of the Project Boundary associated with the Lohman Ridge and Camptonville diversion tunnels. Since these are buried diversion tunnels, the surface above the tunnels will not experience project-related effects. The proposed APE is shown in Attachment 3 to this letter.

In accordance with §800.4(a)(1), YCWA requests your concurrence on the appropriateness of the APE. We respectfully request your concurrence within 30 days of your receipt of this submittal so that we may proceed in a timely fashion with the relicensing process.

p. Although our current intent is to prepare an environmental assessment (EA), there is the possibility that an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) will be required. Nevertheless, this meeting will satisfy the NEPA scoping requirements, irrespective of whether an EA or EIS is issued by the Commission.

Commission staff will hold two scoping meetings in the vicinity of the project at the time and place noted below. The daytime meeting will focus on resource agency, Indian tribes, and non-governmental organization concerns, while the evening meeting is primarily for receiving input from the public. We invite all interested individuals, organizations, and agencies to attend one or both of the meetings, and to assist staff in identifying particular study needs, as well as the scope of environmental issues to be addressed in the environmental document. At the scoping meetings, staff will: (1) initiate scoping of the issues; (2) review and discuss existing conditions and resource management objectives; (3) review and discuss existing information and identify preliminary information and study needs; (4) review and discuss the process plan and schedule for pre-filing activity that incorporates the time frames provided for in Part 5 of the Commission's regulations and, to the extent possible, maximizes coordination of federal, state, and tribal permitting and certification processes; and (5) discuss the appropriateness of any federal or state agency or Indian tribe acting as a cooperating agency for development of an environmental document.

Meeting participants should come prepared to discuss their issues and/or concerns. Please review the PAD in preparation for the scoping meetings. Directions on how to obtain a copy of the PAD and SD1 are included in item n. of this document.


